3d Marine Division Marine wins SNCO Administrator of the Year 19 Aug 2024 | Cpl Eduardo Delatorre, PEO Land Systems OKINAWA, JAPAN --

On July 11th, 2024, U.S Marine Corps Gunnery Sergeant Julius A. Howard, a native of Cherry Point North Carolina, was awarded the Deputy Commandant for Manpower and Reserve Affairs Staff Non-Commissioned Officer Administrator of the Year for the entirety of the Marine Corps, making it the second year in a row that a Marine from 3d Marine Division has received this award, with the first being Staff Sergeant Marianne Joseph, a native of Kalihi, Hawaii.

"These SNCOs are highly engaged leaders," said Lieutenant Colonel Mary E. LeValley, the Assistant Chief of Staff, Personnel, 3d Marine Division. "They placed themselves in the shoes of our junior Marines – they sought to understand their concerns and pressures and then sought to mitigate those problems by lending their leadership and support."

Marines in administrative sections at 3d Marine Division manage tracking and accountability for general, operational, and manpower purposes. In short- they paint an accurate battlefield picture of a large, dispersed unit that is spread throughout the Western Indo-Pacific.

"My initial spark for administration soon transformed into a passion for aiding others and leading a high-functioning team within the Marine Corps," said Howard. "I recognized its importance in every corner of the globe, which fueled my desire to explore and travel."

When Howard checked into 3d Marine Division, he was given the challenge to implement the Electronic Records Management (ERM) System for the entirety of the Division on a tight deadline. The ERM is how all federal agencies are now managing both permanent and temporary records in accessible electronic formats. The effective implementation of the ERM enables 3d Marine Division to be more efficient, accountable, responsive, and operationally effective.

"The success of this project was made possible by the unwavering support of my senior leadership," stated Howard, "They entrusted me with this challenge and provided the necessary time and resources to complete it."

"GySgt Howard aced the 9-month assignment due to his humility and tenacity," said LeValley. "He earned noteworthy recognition from the Commanding General and a Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal for his accomplishments in support of the Commanding General's Readiness Inspection."

Howard said that the most vital key to success is for Marines to take care of each other, no matter their rank or position.

"Whether mentoring Marines or checking someone new into the unit, it's crucial to show genuine care and concern," Howard concluded. "Motivate and train the Marines under your charge so they are prepared to take your place when you're gone."

"The previous winner, Staff Sergeant Marianne Joseph, shared similar qualities that led her to also receive this award the year prior," said LeValley. "Joseph not only maintained the active duty and reserve component staffing slates for the Division and Command Element, but she also assisted the multiple subordinate, battalion sized commands in managing their own slates."

"She was very humble about the reality of being deployed over the holidays and had such a defining servant attitude," said LeValley. "I will never forget it."

The necessity for skilled admin staff non-commissioned officers is evident as they continue to guide, mentor, and empower junior Marines to handle diverse tasks confidently and develop a bias for action. Moreover, their ongoing efforts to develop more efficient workflow processes are crucial for the future success of the administrative team, solidifying their role as the backbone of the Division's operational excellence.

12TH MLR MARINES MAKE HISTORY AS FIRST TO ACHIEVE NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICER RANKS ON CAMP ISHIGAKI DURING RD24

JAPAN GROUND SELF-DEFENSE FORCE CAMP ISHIGAKI, OKINAWA, JAPAN --

In a historic moment for the 12th Marine Littoral Regiment and the U.S. Marine Corps, Lance Cpl. Chue Lee and Lance Cpl. Tyler Clinard both promoted to the rank of corporal during exercise Resolute Dragon 24 on August 1, 2024, marking the first time Marines have reached this milestone on Japan Ground Self-Defense Force Camp Ishigaki, Okinawa, Japan.

This is the second year that U.S. Marines have actively participated in Resolute Dragon at JGSDF Camp Ishigaki. The strategic inclusion of Camp Ishigaki in this exercise signifies the deepening of military cooperation and commitment to regional security in the Indo-Pacific area.

This year's iteration of the exercise holds a particular significance as it marks the first time U.S. Marines have been promoted to the non-commissioned officer ranks at this location.

"It's an honor," said Cpl. Chue Lee, a native of Anchorage, Alaska, and radio operator with 12th Marine Littoral Regiment. "I am so proud to have been promoted here. Now that I'm a corporal I will need to set the example for my junior Marines and learn how to lead and mentor them."

Promoting Marines with 12th Marine Littoral Regiment on Camp Ishigaki for the first time underscores the strategic focus on integrating American and Japanese military efforts, demonstrating the commitment to developing leadership and readiness among the ranks right where these exercises occur.

"Cpl. Lee's promotion is monumental in that it highlights how much of a role the individual Marine can have in the context of the partnership between the U.S. and Japan." said 1st Lt. Beijing Xiao, a communications officer with 12th MLR. "As our forces modernize, Marines such as Cpl. Lee pave the way for the unit to become far more lethal and expeditionary. Cpl. Lee's promotion on Camp Ishigaki is proof of our continuing efforts to bolster the MLR's relationship with the JGSDF."

For the Marines themselves, this ceremony at Camp Ishigaki carries deep personal significance. It is a testament to their dedication, hard work, and leadership potential. Achieving the rank of Corporal is a pivotal moment in their careers, representing not only a professional milestone but also the embodiment of their commitment to serve and lead.

"I feel it's important that my promotion took place here of all places because normally Marines don't have the opportunity to promote in a foreign country, let alone a place that Marines have only set foot on once before," said Cpl. Tyler Clinard, a Montgomery, Pennsylvania native and intelligence analyst with 12th MLR. "To be promoted here at Camp Ishigaki not only shows the cohesion within our ranks but also our partners' ranks."

The promotions also deeply resonate with the families and loved ones of the Marines, who have supported them throughout their journey. The personal ties that bind these Marines to their families, peers, and the broader mission of peace and security in the Indo-Pacific region are as strong as the commitment they have shown in reaching this new chapter in their military careers.

"Watching this transition is like being on top of a mountain, there is no greater view! Being a Marine dad, there is no greater honor," said Jackie Clinard, Cpl. Clinard's father. "I handed the Corps a boy, and they returned me America's best Marine!"

As the ceremony concluded, Corporals Lee and Clinard proudly joined their fellow Marines who congratulated them on the impressive milestone in their careers. This historic promotion at Camp Ishigaki emphasizes their accomplishments and marks a promising future for the Marine Corps in the Indo-Pacific region.

Both Marines are currently deployed in support of Resolute Dragon 24, an annual bilateral exercise in Japan that strengthens the command, control, and multi-domain maneuver capabilities of U.S. Marines in III Marine Expeditionary Force and Japan Self-Defense Force personnel, with a focus on controlling and defending key maritime terrain.



to resolve. However, each year we present a package of wonderful gatherings for the enjoyment of everyone.


You may wonder where I'm going with this and here it comes. Where are our volunteers? Why cannot

It is home to the famous Gunfight at the OK Corral and Boothill Graveyard. There is lots to do there including live gunfight reenactments.





HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED WHY?

Tootsie Rolls hold significance with the Marine Corps? During the Korean War, the First Marine Division met the enemy in the mountains surrounding the Chosin reservoir in subfreezing temperatures. Out of ammunition. Marines called in for 60mm mortar ammo; code name "Tootsie Rolls." The radio operator did not have the code sheets that would tell him what a "Tootsie Roll" was, but knew the request was urgent; so, he called in the order. Soon, pallets of Tootsie Roll candies parachuted from the sky to the First Marine Division! While not ammunition, this candy from the sky provided well needed nourishment for the troops. They also learned they could use warmed Tootsie Rolls to plug bullet holes, sealing them as they refroze.

Over two weeks of incessant fighting, the 15,000-man division suffered 3,000 killed in action, 6,000 wounded and thousands of severe frostbite cases. But they accomplished their goal and destroyed several Chinese divisions in the process. Many credited their very survival to Tootsie Rolls. Surviving Marines called themselves "The Chosin Few."








27 November ~ 13 December 1950

The U.S. Marines at the Chosin Reservoir begin their "attack in a different direction" as they engage in a fighting retreat to the port of Hungnam. Two entire Chinese armies have been tasked with the destruction of the 1st Marine Division. They succeed in driving the American force from North Korean territory but pay an enormous price: as many as 80,000 Chinese troops are killed or wounded, and the CPVF Ninth Army Group is rendered combat-ineffective for months. "Frozen Chosin" becomes one of the most-storied episodes in U.S. Marine Corps


The family of LtCol Jones, in memory of his service to his country, Marine Corps, and the Association generously funds this scholarship annually for the applicant with the greatest financial need.

This is the exact replica of the DC Memorial, as the sculptor/artist, Dr. Felix W. de Weldon, gifted his original, full-sized working model to the Marine Military Academy, in his word, "to inspire our young cadets". It was dedicated April 16, 1982, on the MMA Parade Ground. The Marine at the base of the flag was a local area resident, Cpl Harlon Block, USMC, Nov 6, 1924 - Mar. 1, 1945. He is buried behind the Iwo Jima Memorial at the Marine Military Academy.



The Memorial Scholarship Fund committee is advancing a committee-approved amendment to possibly include an active-duty Marine who would need financial assistance in sending a son to the Marine Military Academy.
